CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF THE CHAPTER HOUSE


The Cal Beta SAE Chapter purchased the property at 2722 Bancroft Way, Berkeley in 1922 (100 years ago!). The Chapter resided in a Victorian building there for 4 years until the newly constructed House (which is still in use) was completed in 1926. Legendary Cal Football Coach Andy Smith donated about \$30,000 from his estate for the building of the new House. The House Corp. obtained a \$40,000 mortgage to complete the construction.

There have been numerous times over the 100 years of Cal Beta SAE residing at 2722 Bancroft Way that the Chapter was in danger of losing the House and/or being dissolved, but for the efforts of numerous students and Alumni:

- The Cal Beta SAE Chapter purchased the property at 2722
 Bancroft Way, Berkeley in 1922 (100 years ago!). The
 Chapter resided in a Victorian building there for 4 years
 until the newly constructed House (which is still in use)
 was completed in 1926.
- Legendary Cal Football Coach Andy Smith donated about \$30,000 from his estate for the building of the new House. The House Corp. obtained a \$40,000 mortgage to complete the construction.
- During the 1930's Great Depression the House faced extreme financial stress and persevered under the leadership of Charles West.
- During the 1940's World War II, the House was leased to the US. Navy and the Chapter operated out of members' apartments.
- In the 1960's during the Free Speech movement, very few students joined fraternities and the House was sold to Judge Landies, and leased back to the Chapter.
- In the late 1970's Judge Landies tried to evict the Chapter, and the Cal Beta Investors purchased the House back from Judge Landies.
- In the 1990's the "1894 Club" formed the current nonprofit "2722 Bancroft Educational Institute, Inc." and the Cal Beta Investors transferred ownership to this new nonprofit entity.
- In 2000, the House was closed by the City of Berkeley for 29 code violations. Many Alums rallied and donated money and 4 Alums signed as guarantors for a \$1.1M loan to remodel the House.
- In 2002 the House reopened with only 6 members and quickly reestablished itself as the leading fraternity at Cal.

As an undergraduate Justin was the philanthropy chairman for the Cal Beta chapter, in which he held the South Seas Charity Beach Volleyball Tournament 2 years in a row.

Since graduating from Berkeley, Justin has continued to stay engaged with its alumni network. In 2013, he co-founded The Blue & Gold Bas, the first young alumni gala, which served as the

University's most influential annual young alumni event and engagement tool Over 600 alumni were in attendance and thousands of dollars were raised when Justin helped run the organization. While ownership was officially transferred over to the University in 2017, Justin was key in growing the operating budget up to \$50,000 in 2015 based on demand. Additionally, Justin Co-Founded the Berkeley Alumni Club of New York, the region's largest young alumni group in partnership with the University. In his time as a member of UC Berkeley Sigma Alpha Epsilon (BA '82) Dr. Valli was the Beta chapter's Pledge Trainer, Social Chairman, and Budweiser Campus Ambassador. As a Budweiser Ambassador, he raised over \$50,000 for Muscular Dystrophy Foundation and the United States Olympic Committee during two of Beta's charity events. In his own words "outside of meeting my wife Veronica and the birth of my four children the Bro Experience is the highlight of my life!" Robert's extensive success

after graduating from Berkeley began in the heart of Silicon Valley at Stanford Graduate School of Business (SEP '95) where he now holds a number of technology ventures and in 2006 Robert became the Director for Advancing Innovation at non-profit Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation. The Kauffman's renowned platform for all-things-entrepreneurial, offered a lens by which to observe the interchange of academia and industry. CHAPTER STORIES



John C. ("Jack") Leathers pledged Sigma Alpha Epsilon at the University of Minnesota in 1951, became an SAE at Washington when his family moved to the Pacific Northwest, and became a member of Cal Beta when his family moved to the Bay Area. A member of Cal's crew team, in less than two years, his leadership abilities were recognized and he was elected Eminent Archon of the chapter and inducted into the Order of the Golden Bear. Having been enrolled in Cal's Air Force ROTC program, after graduation he trained as a B-47 pilot. Having served three years in the air force, John returned to civilian life and trained with Merrill Lynch in New York City where he was a stocks and bonds broker for over five years. He left to become a corporate lender, first in leasing, then in commercial finance in Chicago. He subsequently returned to San Francisco where he ran Lloyds Bank's corporate secured lending program for many years.

In 1995, John, now Jack, typed and mailed postcards to those 1950 Cal Beta brothers who were living in the Bay Area, inviting them to a lunch at San Francisco's Anchor Beer headquarters (whose marketing director was Phil Rogers,

the EA before Jack). The luncheon was most successful and was continued in San Francisco until the South Bay brothers suggested The Fish Market in San Mateo. About that time Jack tired of typing individual postcards and asked Jim Kidder '57, who had volunteered his computer skills for several years, to take over the luncheon. Jim named the luncheon "The Jack Leathers Christmas Reunion" and began referring to the group of attendees as "The Fabulous 'Fifties". A few years later, the convener of the Big Band Brothers (brothers from the 'forties) asked Jim to include them in his invitation list, which he did. With most of the attendees coming from the North Bay and the Sacramento area, Bob Leslie, through his daughter, Lynn, arranged to have the luncheon at the Round Hills Country Club in Alamo. For the last several years, the luncheon was held there until the pandemic hiatus. The post-pandemic price of the club forced a relocation of the reunion and they met in the chapter house in 2021 and will return to it on Thursday, December 8th, in 2022.

N.B. Jack was inducted into the Andy Smith Cal Beta Hall of Fame in 2012.

The Fabulous 'Fifties'

"The Fabulous 'Fifties" has been used to describe those who were in the house in the 'fifties as Cal Beta won three consecutive All-University intramural championships. It also had over a dozen brothers letter in football; three in basketball; at one time had five starters on and the captain of the rugby team; five on the baseball team that won the College World Series in 1957; and multiple letter-winners in track and cross country; swimming and water polo; golf; tennis; and volleyball. It had presidents of Big and Circle C, an ASUC president and two ASUC vice presidents, and at least one representative-at-large out of eight for five consecutive years on the Executive Committee that ran the ASUC (which in those days ran the entire Cal athletic program). It won the

Spring Sing and had three of the four members of the senior octet of Men's Glee Club. It won the University's Pledge Class Scholarship Trophy and had a brother tie for the University Medal. And, sixteen 1950's brothers have been inducted into the Hall of Fame.

All this occurred at a time when for a nickel you could get a coke and make a phone call in the privacy of a booth, see a movie with a bag of popcorn for less than a dollar, a sports car for under \$3,000 and a nice home in the Berkeley Hills for \$20,000. And the songs had melodies. Those were the fabulous 'fifties!
